- Researchers will not analyze your course assignments for research purposes until after grades have been submitted. Data shared with other researchers will have all your identifiers removed first.
- Your instructor will not know if you declined to participate in this study until after grades are posted.
- Possible risks/discomforts associated with the study are small invasion of your privacy and the unlikely but possible breach of confidentiality of your course and student information.
- There are no direct benefits from participation in the study. However, this study may explain how to teach more effectively at UCI.
- You will not be compensated for your participation in this research study.
- All research data collected will be stored securely and confidentially on researcher computers and in locked file cabinets. Student IDs will be removed and replaced with unique codes. Data may be kept indefinitely.
- The research team, and authorized UCI personnel may have access to your study records to protect your safety and welfare. Any information derived from this research project that personally identifies you will not be voluntarily released or disclosed by these entities without your separate consent, except as specifically required by law.
